

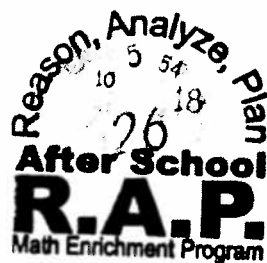

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We believe your child would benefit greatly from our afterschool program. We are offering a limited number of students an opportunity to participate and hope your son or daughter will take advantage of this special opportunity. We have used data from MCAS, staff recommendations, and report cards to select students we believe would enjoy participating.

The afterschool program is offered in three sessions and will run daily from 2:25 until 4:30, Monday through Thursday as follows:

- Session 1:** September 27 - December 16, 2010  
**Mini Session:** January 10 - February 10, 2011  
**Session 2:** February 28 - May 19, 2011

**There is no afterschool program on half days and when school is closed and/or cancelled.**

The program includes an academic support component, a healthy snack, and fun clubs that provide new learning opportunities for your child. At the end of the day, limited transportation is provided to neighborhood stops. **A materials fee of \$20 for each session is being collected this year to help cover program costs.**

Students need to commit to the same two days per week (as a minimum) to be a part of the program, but may commit to three or four days. Once a family enrolls their child they are guaranteed a slot as long as attendance is good. If your child has more than two unexcused absences, s/he will be asked to leave the program.

Students may participate in intramurals, after-help sessions with teachers, after-school clubs, band, etc. throughout the year and also may partake of these activities within the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Afterschool Program. Sign-up information for this program is attached. Space is limited.

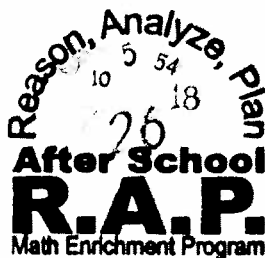

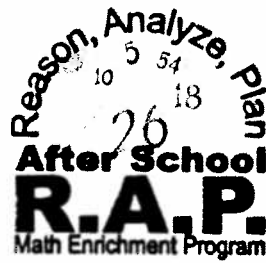
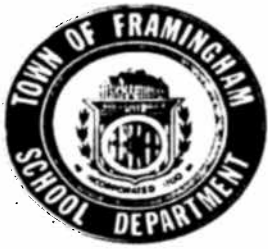

**Contract for Bus Riders – 2010/2011**

As part of the Afterschool program we are happy to offer limited transportation home. It is expected that students act respectfully and responsibly not only during regular program hours, but also when using transportation.

Please note that if it is brought to our attention that a student is acting inappropriately on the bus, he/she may be suspended from the bus and/or program for a stated period of time from 1 day up to 5 days. Repeated problems will result in students' loss of privilege to ride the bus/van. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Guidelines for behavior on the bus:

- Students must be safe: they must remain seated at all times.
- Students must keep their voices down to a normal talking level so that they will not distract the driver: no shouting, screaming, etc.
- Students must be respectful of other bus riders: no name calling, hitting, pushing, etc.
- Students must be respectful of the bus/van: no throwing trash in the vehicle or writing anywhere on the vehicle.

Bus Stops:

**For safety reasons, students will be let off the bus only at their scheduled bus stops as determined by the Framingham Public Schools Department of Transportation, unless an arrangement has been made between the student's parent/guardian, afterschool program staff and the bus driver.**

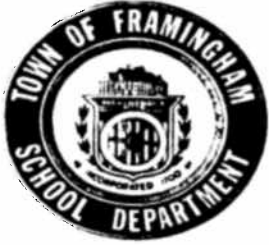

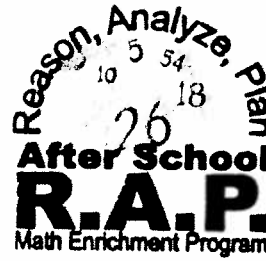

### Simple Stitching
