1. ancient	Adjective <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. of or in time long past <i>ancient history.</i>2. from a remote period <i>ancient rocks; ancient trees.</i>3. very old; aged:<i>an ancient folk tale.</i>
2. bleak	Adjective <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. empty, lifeless, and often windswept: <i>a bleak plain.</i>2. cold and piercing; raw:<i>a bleak wind.</i>3. without hope or encouragement; depressing; dreary: <i>a bleak future.</i>
3. bulky	Adjective <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. large size.2. (with fabric or yarn) thick; lofty.3. (with clothes) made of thick, sturdy fabric or yarn: <i>a bulky sweater.</i>
4. dingy	Adjective <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. dark, dull, or dirty color; lacking brightness or freshness.2. shabby.
5. foliage	Noun <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. the leaves of a plant, collectively; leafage.2. the representation of leaves, flowers, and branches in painting, architectural ornament, etc.
6. frequent	Adjective <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. happening or occurring at short intervals:<i>to make frequent trips to Tokyo.</i>2. constant, habitual, or regular: <i>a frequent guest.</i>3. located at short distances apart: <i>frequent towns along the shore.</i>
7. frills	Noun <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. edges, like a strip of cloth or lace, gathered at one end and let loose at the other; ruffle.

8. lush	<p>Adjective</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. (with vegetation, plants, grasses, etc.) full, tender and juicy. 2. Described as having a lot of vegetation: <i>a lush valley.</i> 3. Described as luxurious: <i>the lush surroundings of his home.</i>
9. occasional	<p>Adjective</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. occurring or appearing at irregular or infrequent intervals; occurring now and then: <i>an occasional headache.</i> 2. intended for use when needed: <i>an occasional chair.</i>
10. petite	<p>Adjective</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. (usually a woman) short and having a small figure.
11. portion	<p>Noun</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. a part of any whole: <i>I read a portion of the manuscript.</i> 2. an amount of food served for one person; serving; helping: <i>He took a large portion of spinach.</i> 3. the part of a whole; share.
12. putter	<p>Verb (used without object)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to be busy or occupy oneself in a leisurely, casual, or ineffective manner: <i>to putter in the garden.</i> 2. to move or go in an ineffective way or with little energy or purpose: <i>to putter about the house on a rainy day.</i> 3. to move or go slowly or aimlessly.

13. rust	<p>Noun</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. the red or orange coating that forms on the surface of iron when exposed to air and moisture. 2. any coating on metal or a stain resembling this coating.
14. sapling	<p>Noun</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. a young tree. 2. a young person.
15. shatter	<p>Verb (used with object)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to break (something) into pieces, like with a blow. 2. to damage, by breaking or crushing: <i>ships shattered by storms.</i> 3. to impair or destroy (health, nerves, etc.): <i>The incident shattered his nerves.</i>
16. shred	<p>Noun</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. a piece cut or torn off, especially in a narrow strip. 2. a bit; scrap: <i>We haven't got a shred of evidence.</i>
17. sliver	<p>Noun</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. a small, slender, often sharp piece, as of wood or glass, split, broken, or cut off from the whole; splinter. 2. any small, narrow piece or portion: <i>A sliver of sky was visible.</i>
18. spoil	<p>Verb (used with object)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to damage severely or harm (something), especially with reference value or usefulness: <i>The water stain spoiled the painting. Drought spoiled the corn crop.</i> 2. to lessen the quality of: <i>Bad weather spoiled their vacation.</i> 3. to impair, damage, or harm the character or nature of (someone): <i>to spoil a child by pampering him.</i>
19. sprint	<p>Verb (used with object)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to move quickly across an area: <i>to sprint a half</i>

	<p><i>mile.</i></p> <p>Noun</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. a short race at full speed. 2. a burst of speed at any point during a long race, as near the finish line. 3. a brief spell of great activity.
20. straggle	<p>Verb (used without object)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to stray from the road, course, or line of march. 2. to wander about in a scattered fashion; ramble. 3. to spread or be spread in a scattered fashion or at irregular intervals:<i>The trees straggle over the countryside.</i>
21. strand	<p>Verb (used with object)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to drive or leave (a ship, fish, etc.) aground or ashore:<i>The low tide stranded the whale.</i> 2. to bring into or leave in a helpless position:<i>He was stranded in the middle of nowhere.</i>
22. strength	<p>Noun</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. the quality or state of being strong; bodily or muscular power; vigor. 2. mental power, force, or vigor. 3. moral power, firmness, or courage.
23. thrive	<p>Verb</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to prosper; be fortunate or successful. 2. to grow or develop vigorously; flourish:<i>The children thrived in the country.</i>
24. toil	<p>Noun</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. hard and continuous work; exhausting labor or effort. 2. a laborious task. Struggle
