Please be aware of the directions below for how to submit scholarships:

Scholarships with PRIVATE APPLICATIONS:

Scholarships with private applications should be submitted to the address and/or email indicated on its unique application, which can be found in this newsletter and/or on Naviance.

Scholarships using the FHS APPLICATION:

Scholarships using the FHS application should be emailed to Mrs. Erikson, College & Career Counselor, at rschmid@framingham.k12.ma.us. Copies of the FHS application can be found on Naviance; the essay topic can be found in the black box at the top of the application.

If a scholarship uses an FHS application, it should be submitted to Ms. Erikson on ONE EMAIL that includes the application and the essay as a PDF ATTACHMENT, with the scholarship name as the subject line.

Charles Elliot II Scholarship (\$500) -- Due May 5, 2021

The Metropolitan Area Planning Council annually presents a scholarship award in memory of Charles W. Eliot II. Mr. Eliot was an advocate of local planning as part of regional cooperation, and he was especially interested in land use planning as it affected transportation (coordination of trains, buses, cars, bicycles, and pedestrians), the need for communities to balance residential, business, and open space, and the role of planning to solve modern problems (like today's climate change). This scholarship is open to any senior in a secondary school in the 101 cities and towns of the MAPC region, who is planning to further his/her/their education in these fields. A cash prize of at least \$500 will be awarded in the form of a scholarship to the school of the recipient's choice. Applications for this award must be submitted by email as an attachment to handerson@mapc.org with the subject Charles W. Eliot II Scholarship, or mailed to Charles W. Eliot II Scholarship, Metropolitan Area Planning Council, 60 Temple Place, Boston, MA 02111 no later than Wednesday, May 5, 2021. Award will be made in late May at the MAPC Annual Meeting (to which the winning student is cordially invited to attend).

As a general rule, if an application asks for your social security number and you do not have one yet, leave that space blank but fill out and turn in the otherwise completed application. Many scholarship awards can be processed with just the student's name and address. If a scholarship specifically requests a SSN, ask if it is possible to submit an ITIN instead.
