



## Preview of Future Planning Senior Year



- Go visit colleges/program campuses (attend tours, information sessions, open houses).
- Continue to use Naviance to explore your options ([connection.naviance.com/framingham](http://connection.naviance.com/framingham)).
- Finalize your path and determine which schools/programs to which you will apply.
- Sign up to attend college representative visits at FHS through Naviance.
- Take standardized tests as required by your college/program (SAT/ACT/ SAT Subject Tests/ Accuplacer/ TOEFL/ASVAB)
- Complete Financial Aid Applications- FAFSA (and CSS Profile if applicable).
- Complete college/program applications (4 Year/ 2 Year/ Gap/ Vocational Training)
  - **Letters of Recommendation:** speak with teachers/counselors about letters of recommendation as required by your prospective colleges/programs.
  - **FHS Transcript:** request that FHS send your transcript to the colleges/programs to which you are applying (there is a minimum 15 school day processing period for all transcript requests).
  - **Standardized Test Scores:** request that your official score reports (SAT/ ACT/ TOEFL) be sent to your colleges/programs through the test center website.
- Access your school counselor and the college and career center for help with future planning as needed.
- Research and apply for scholarships throughout the year.
- If attending four year college, declare where you will attend and submit your deposit by **May 1<sup>st</sup> 2024**.

## Attend Future Planning Events at FHS Senior Year!

- September 2023 (Date TBD): Attend **College & Career Planning Night for Seniors** at Framingham High School.
- September-November 2023: Students should attend **college visits** happening at the high school (these visits can be viewed and students can sign up on Naviance).
- October 2023 (Date TBD): Attend **future planning event(s)** hosted by school counselors on Future's Day at Framingham High School.
- November 2023 (Various): Attend a virtual **FAFSA Day** (for help with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid).
