<p>R.I.S.E: Reading, Intervention, STEAM, Exhibition.</p>	<p>R.I.S.E is the district academic intervention summer program focused on literacy and STEAM. In partnership with the Multilingual Department, we serve about 200 students. Students receive academic support in the morning then STEAM programming in the afternoon with community partners.</p>	K-1	July 5th - July 28th
<p>Intro to Middle School</p>	<p>This program is geared towards rising 6th graders. Team building, tours, and activities are designed to help new middle schoolers make the transition from elementary to middle school.</p> <p>Intro to Middle School is a unique opportunity for a one week program for students to get in the door first, explore, learn, adapt and grow. These students will collaborate with school staff and the YMCA, focusing on SEL and leadership development.</p> <p>The program will be held at Framingham High School on Monday and Tuesday. On Wednesday of each week, students will be at their specific building, getting acclimated to new surroundings and building relationships with administrators and the student support team. This gives students additional time and support to complete assignments and/or missed time.
