<p>New Initiatives for Summer 2020</p>	<p>Summer Reading Club (English, Spanish, Portuguese) Description: CRD will select a summer reading book in each language for 4th and 5th grade and host a weekly book club. This will be free and open to all students. Registration will be sent out via google form June 29th.</p> <p>Elementary Live Enrichment & Check-ins Description: Explorers coordinators host a weekly live check in via google hangouts for students to hang out and tell jokes, answer trivia, discuss the woes of chores etc. These weekly check ins will continue through the summer.</p>
<p>Summer Scene: Artists, Athletes, and STEAMers Description: The Artists, Athletes, and STEAMers program is designed for students to explore their interests and take them to new levels. Students are enrolled in a track and explore a variety of topics from pottery, mosaics, sports, experiments, robotics, and more!</p> <p>Number of Students: 300</p>	<p>A Summer Scene: Artists, Athletes, and STEAMers Description: The Artists, Athletes, and STEAMers program has been revamped into a remote model. Parents purchase kits (\$50 for each child) for a two-week session with over 25+ activities spanning all three topic areas. In addition to these kits, there are optional live sessions led by CRD staff three times a week.</p> <p>Number of Students: 200</p>
<p>Summer Scene: Framingham Youth Theatre Company Description: The Youth Theatre Company, in partnership with the Fine and Performing Arts Department will rehearse, act, sing, dance, and design our way to production for entering 1st-5th graders All of the workshops are run by FPS Directors and Choreographers and will include, voice, dance, acting, and technical theater. The program requires a four-week commitment due to the productions.</p> <p>Number of Students: 40</p>	<p>Summer Scene: Framingham Youth Theatre Company Description: On Hold until further guidance is provided on in-person programming. Potentially pilot a smaller in-person version in August.</p>

<p>Summer Scene Club Exitos/Suceso (Partnership with Bilingual Department)</p> <p>Description: The Club Exitos program is a Two-Way Spanish program for students to enhance their learning of Spanish language and culture during the summer. Students are in mixed-age classrooms and continue their language use while engaging in a variety of STEAM and enrichment activities. (Club Suceso, a two-way language Portuguese program was also offered but did not run due to limited enrollment)</p> <p>Number of Students: 15</p>	<p>Summer Scene Club Exitos/Suceso (Partnership with Bilingual Department)</p> <p>Description: On Hold until further guidance is provided on in-person programming. Potentially pilot a smaller in-person version in August.</p>
<p>R.I.S.E (Reading, Intervention, STEAM, Exhibition)</p> <p>Description: R.I.S.E is the elementary academic intervention summer program focused on literacy and STEAM. In partnership with Framingham State University, Title I, Teaching and Learning, and Bilingual department</p> <p>Number of Students: 150</p>	<p>R.I.S.E (Reading, Intervention, STEAM, Exhibition)</p> <p>Description: The program will run remotely and partnerships remain, the program has shifted to a virtual model. The model will focus on a small group coaching model. Teachers will be assigned 6 students to work with over 6 weeks. The program was previously 4 weeks, due to the increased need for students, we have extended the program by 2 weeks.</p> <p>Number of Students: 150</p>
<p>Middle School TV Production</p> <p>Description: Partnership with Access TV - 2-week program that focuses on media production. Students will learn cameras, editing software, green screens, audio, scriptwriting, and acting.</p> <p>Number of Students: 50</p>	<p>Flyers After School TV Program (FAST Program)</p> <p>Description: The program will run remotely for 4 weeks and partnerships remain, students will be provided with a supply kit. Students will learn cameras, editing software, green screens, audio, scriptwriting, and acting.</p> <p>Number of Students: 30</p>
<p>Middle School Discoverers</p> <p>Description: This program will be based around STEAM projects. They will be working on things relating to environmental awareness in fun and exciting ways.</p>	<p>Middle School Discoverers</p> <p>Description: Program resources and curriculum were combined with TV production to extend the offering from two weeks to four</p>

<p>Intro to Middle School Description: This program is geared towards rising 6th graders. Team building, tours, and activities designed to help new middle schoolers make the transition from elementary to middle school.</p> <p>Number of Students: 50</p>	<p>Intro to Middle School Description: On Hold until further guidance is provided on in-person programming. Potentially pilot a smaller in-person version in August.</p>
<p>RFL Summer Program Description: Our incoming freshman group will meet at Framingham High School for two weeks in July, for four hours per day to discuss the change in academic and social expectations at the high school versus middle schools. They will meet with the program teacher and social worker as well as current students and alums and academic department heads to learn about the program and school dynamics. The program will also include tours of the high school so that students will be familiar with navigating the large school building.</p> <p>Number of Students: 16</p>	<p>RFL Summer Program Description: Our incoming freshman group will meet via Google Meets with the program teacher and social worker to discuss the transition from the middle schools to high school. We expect to meet 3 times per week for an hour each time over the course of 3 weeks. If we can get into the building for a tour before school starts we will do that too. The students will receive summer reading books and guided reading questions so that we can go through one book together and we will then order them a second book of their choosing to meet the English Department requirements. We hope to include guest speakers such as academic department heads, possibly a motivational speaker and some current students and alums to set the tone for our high expectations.</p> <p>Number of Students: 12</p>
